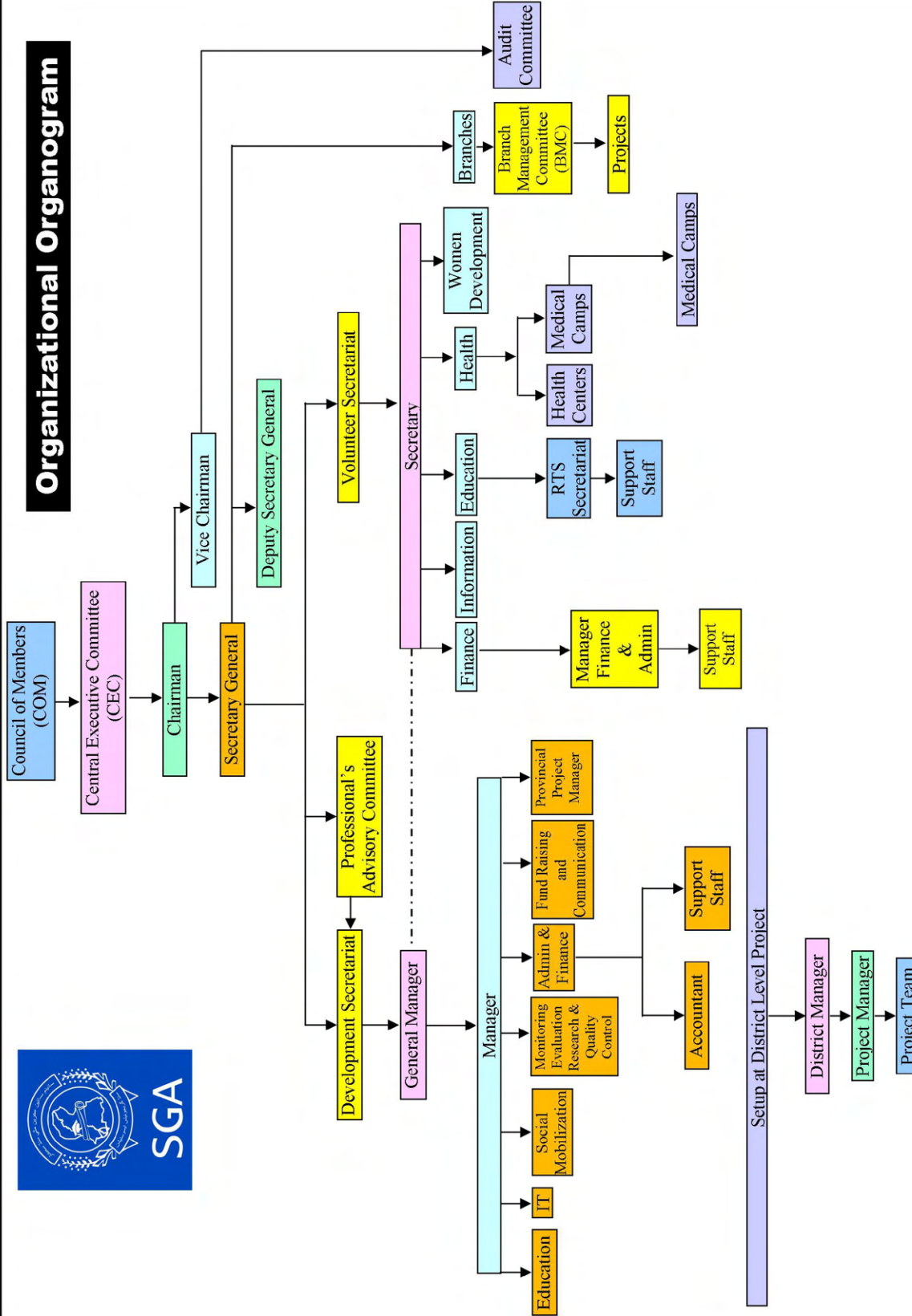

VISION

Construction of peaceful developed society in Sindh.

MISSION STATEMENT

SGA is a Human Social Organization, which recognizes intercultural and interpersonal as the fundamental basis for voluntary work.

PROFILE OF THE ASSOCIATION

Sindh Graduates Association have come a long way since it was first formed in 1972 as a non-profit, non-sectarian and non-political civil society organization. It is a registered body operating under Societies Registration Act (XXI) of 1860 registered from September 29, 1972. The Association evolved from coming together of a small group of individuals concerned over the poor level of development existing in Sindh. Sindh Graduates Association was formed by few liberal and enlightened individuals in early 70s with the vision of construction of peaceful, tolerate and affluent society in Sindh through educating the people and promoting culture and language. Now, it has emerged with network of 122 branches in Sindh including one branch each at Islamabad and Lahore. Today it boosts up a membership of over 9,000 Graduate Volunteers in 80 towns and villages of Sindh. These Graduate volunteer members are included senior advocates, Civil Judges, Bureaucrats, Journalists, Bankers, Traders, Businessman, Teachers, professors and other senior members of Civil Society.

Keeping in view the remarkable experience in the field of Education since 1980 on self-help basis. Presently SGA is operating 21 Roshan Tara Schools in backward areas of Sindh with the enrollment of 7,864 students. These schools are imparting quality and standard education at a very low cost for rural and marginalized students of Sindh. Besides, Sindh Graduates Association have been implementing a mega project by launching Public School Gadap, Karachi in collaboration with Government of Sindh, under Public Private Partnership policy. The Public School Gadap is a residential school, where 509 students have been enrolled and a qualified and experienced faculty has also been engaged. The Public School Gadap is running under the supervision and decision-making body of most experienced and intellectuals' members of Board of Governors BoG.

Sindh Graduates Association is working in the areas of Education, promoting Sindhi language as mother tongue language in Sindh, promoting culture, protecting basic human rights, making sure the provision of health facilities in the most backward areas of Sindh. For the fulfillment of such objectives the National and International organizations assigned various projects to the SGA and also gave donations. The ILO, UNICEF, UNESCO, CIDA, the World Bank, SPO, OXFAM, TVO, SEF, SDA, SANA, ActionAid Pakistan, RSPN, INFAQ Foundation, Khushhali Bank, USAID, Jummani family and Government of Sindh.

Sindh Graduates Association have been playing its vital role to promote peace and harmony in Sindh since last 48 years. In the initial years of its formation in 1970- & 80s-decades SGA have taken its major role to mobilize the people around their democratic rights in Zia Era. Due to active and decisive role by SGA, the Zia cabinet-imposed ban on the organization notified a circular that all SGA members who were Government employee, either may leave the membership of SGA or their services would be terminated. Later when Mrs. Benazir Bhutto came in Government in 1988 she taken ban back and restored the activities of Association.

Sindh Graduates Association since the day of its formation have been aligned with Sindh Civil society, more than its 9 thousand active graduate volunteers have been playing their role to protect and support people of Sindh whenever the people were in trouble. At every time of difficult situation people were supported, even during the period of martial law, floods and at the time of droughts people of Sindh were supported by SGA.

The role of SGA to promote Sindhi literature, language, culture and music is also remarkable, SGA have been organizing International Conferences to promote language, culture and promoting Sindh folk music.

Presently SGA is working on Social Mobilization with Khushhali Bank in District Ghotki, Shikarpur, Mirpur Khas, Dadu, Thatta, Umerkot, Kashmore, Kandhkot, Qambert Shahdadkot and Naushero Feroz since 2002 and facilitating Khushhali Bank Ltd to empower rural community and eliminate poverty. The Sindh Graduates Association is one of the member organization of Rural Support Program Network (RSPN) working a cross the Pakistan.

- 47th Annual Day of SGA was celebrated on 1st March-2020 at Arts Council of Pakistan, Karachi
- Fake Domicile and PRCs issue was taken up by SGA, the initial draft was submitted at Government of Sindh, copies of draft were sent to Chief Minister Sindh, Speaker Provincial Assembly, Government of Sindh, Governor Sindh, concerned Secretaries, all Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners, Government of Sindh.

- The delegation of SGA under the leadership of Chairman, Mr. Rafique Ahmad Jaffri met with commissioner Karachi on 12th June-2020 in his office at Karachi and shared serious concern of the Association regarding fake domiciles and PRCs issue in Sindh

- Iqbal Day was celebrated in Roshan Tara Schools on 9th November-2019, on the day the students paid tribute to great Poet Allama Iqbal through reciting his poetry pieces and through delivering speeches to explore his entire life.
- Mango Day was also celebrated by Roshan Tara Schools on 22nd July-2019 as that day is celebrated globally.
- Study Tours, Sport Weeks and recreational activities were conducted by all Roshan Tara Schools.
- Online Classes were started in different Roshan Tara Schools during the Covid-19 situation and due to closure of all Schools. The students were taken online, where concerned teachers took classes and shared home work to the students.
- Cluster wise trainings were conducted at Karachi and Hyderabad on dated 20th July-2020 and on 26 October-2019 consecutively, where teachers of Roshan Tara Schools of surrounding areas were trained on New Active English subject, Amazing Science and Count Down Math by Oxford Effective Teaching Methodologies and understand the Oxford books for getting better teaching and learning outcomes in the Schools.
- Including Skin , Eye and General Camps, total 39 Medical Camps were arranged by different SGA branches in rural and most backward areas of Sindh , wherein 37, 899 patients registered and were given treatment accordingly
- Total 19 Eye Camps were arranged in remote areas of Sindh, wherein 6,912 eye patients were examined, out of them 2,475 were operated and were given lenses on free of cost.

4. The names of roads, railway stations, buildings, restaurants and shops must be written in Sindhi on the signboards displayed over there.
5. It was demanded that the communication in between all Institutions working in Sindh, especially of Government of Sindh must be in Sindhi.
6. The names of products of all major companies may be mentioned in Sindhi language.
7. The official websites of all companies and Institutions must be in Sindhi as well , along with in English language
8. The year, 2020 may be declared and celebrated as “The Year of Sindhi Language”.
9. The historical places of Sindh like Masjid Khuda Abad, Tomb of Yar Muhammad Kalhoro and other may be repaired and maintained well.
10. The demand of Trauma Centre Daultpur may be fulfilled immediately to save the lives of the people, particularly in case of accidents took place on the National High way.
11. The General University, Medical and Engineering Universities may be established in Nosheroferoze, where no any Educational Institution exists to provide higher education to the people living there.




FAKE DOMICILE & PRC ISSUE APPEARED IN SINDH AND ROLE OF SGA



Sindh is passing through very critical time at present due to the issuance of fake Domiciles and Permanent Residence Certificates (PRCs) in various districts by the District Authorities [DCs].

Recently so many reports are highlighted in social, print and electronic media as well, about the fake domiciles and PRCs are identified in different departments of Sindh. As per reports the people of other provinces got

the jobs and admissions in the Institutes of Sindh on the basis of fake domiciles and PRCs. This issue became burning issue in entire Sindh, initially when the images of fake domiciles and PRCs went viral on social media. In the pursuance of such issue Government of Sindh has constituted an enquiry committee to unearth this issue from top to bottom and come up with solutions so that strategy may be planned to protect making fake documents.

It is an assault on the fundamental rights of the people of the Province of Sindh. The Government of Pakistan promulgated the citizenship Act 951 in Pakistan. As per rules the certificate of Domicile could be issued, and this only denotes that such and such person is the residence of Pakistan or the area of Province who was lived there for one year and not less at all. The rules further explains that Domicile has no other purpose except that a particular person has a domicile of Pakistan. Holder of Domicile cannot claim that he is a Permanent Resident of the area and is entitled to benefits attached to the said area. The fundamental distinction exists between the concept of Domicile and PRC. The former relates to the status of the person and involves the question of law. At the same time, the latter is a question of fact. "Domicile" and "Permanent Residence Certificate" are altogether different concepts. In fact and by the concerned law "The Permanent Residence Certificate" will have to be issued to the permanent resident of the province such as he or she is legitimately born in Sindh, his/her father is domiciled in Sindh, or he or she was born after the death of his or her father at the time of the death domiciled in Sindh. Likewise his or her father has put in service in Govt. of Sindh for one full year.

Looking at this issue the Sindh Graduates Association took its role to mitigate this issue, initially SGA called a meeting of the legal rights experts to make a draft to face issue of fake domiciles and PRCs.



Consultation Meeting called by SGA on Fake Domicile and PRC issue

Sindh Graduates Association called a consultation meeting on issue of Fake Domicile and PRCs at Mehran Hotel Karachi on 1st June-2020. Including the top leadership of the Sindh Graduates Associations, representatives of the prominent social and development organizations, political parties, the renowned writers, journalists, advocates and others attended the seminar and talked on the issue and proposed their suggestions to resolve this issue permanently. The honorable Chairman of SGA Mr Rafique Ahmed Jaffery, Secretary General Prof. Khalid Hussain Channa and renowned writer and Chairman Board of Governance Public School Gadap Prof. Aijaz Qureshi presented the current scenario of the issue and read out the initial draft on the matter. Later the participants talked in detail on the issue of fake Domicile and PRC and proposed their suggestions to make concerned Law more effective. Speaking in the seminar the special advisor to CM Sindh Mr Ashfaq Memon said that Government of Sindh is very much sensitive on the issue of fake Domiciles and PRCs being entertained for seeking Jobs and admissions in Sindh by the people outside the province. He said that Government of Sindh has already formed an enquiry committee who has started its work. In the light of findings of the committee and proposed draft by the SGA, the Government of Sindh will incorporate all suggestions and will review the concerned law so that the rights of local people may be protected well. The Honorable Chairman SGA Mr Rafique Ahmed Jaffery said that the SGA always take its vital role to resolve the burning issues facing by the people of Sindh. The current issue of trafficking of people from other provinces to Sindh through fake Domicile and PRCs is big issue which cannot be afforded at any cost. He said that SGA has called a consultation meeting to discuss on the issue and come up with solutions in the shape of draft to be presented to Government of Sindh for implementation. In the meeting Vice Chairman SGA Peeral Khan Khoso, Prof. Aijaz Qureshi, Advocate Amanullah Shaikh, Ibrar Qazi, Taj Muhammad Wassan, Dr. Mehboob Shaikh, Ishaque Lashari, Dr. Qasim Rajpar, Unis Maher, Muhammad Khan Shaikh, Waqar Patoli, Abdul Karim Chandio, Imam Ali Detho and other renowned writers and intellectuals and social and development specialists attended the meeting and talked on the issue. At the end of the meeting the suggestions of the participants were collected and incorporated in the initial draft. The final draft was sent to the Chief Minister Sindh, Law Minister, Speaker Provincial Assembly, Government of Sindh, Commissioner Karachi and all Deputy Commissioners (DCs) of all districts of Sindh.

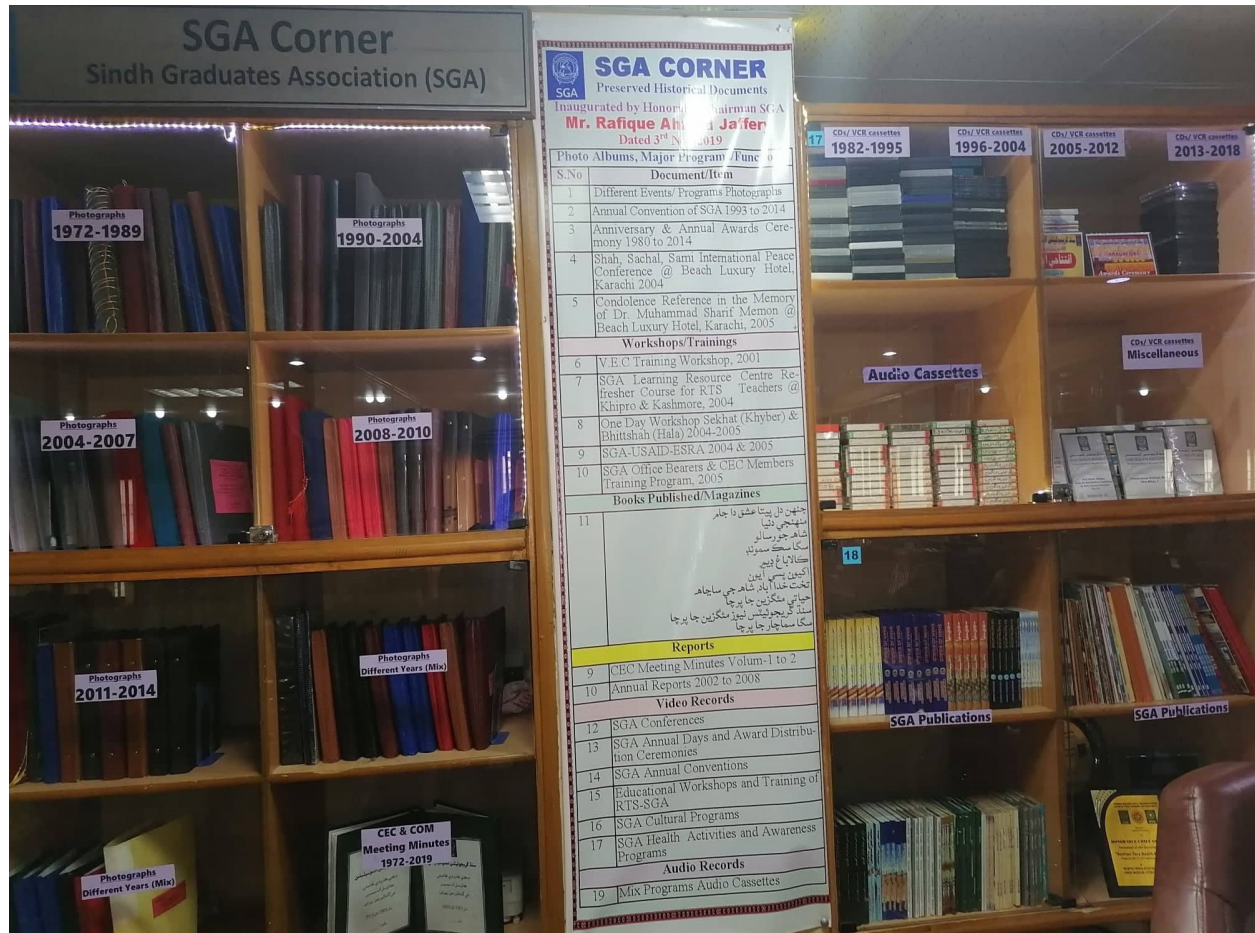


PRESS CONFERENCE BY SGA OFFICIALS TO RESOLVE ISSUE OF FAKE DOMICILES AND PRC IN SINDH

SCHEME OF PRESERVATION OF SGA HISTORICAL RECORD



Sindh Graduates Association is only organization working in Sindh, which is going to complete its half of the century for serving its people on purely volunteer basis. Since the day of its existing (1972) , there are hundreds and thousands of photographs , printed and manual reports, recorded cassetts (video as well as audio cassetts) available at SGA head office but in a very unorganized and scattered shape. Looking at the importance of such material, it was decided to maintain that record well so that the loss of such historical record may be protected and life of the material may be extended. In this regard a Scheme was planned and initiated to implement as followed. The separate Corner in the name of "SGA Corner "has been established at Mazhar ul Din Memon Resource Centre at head office, Karachi, where all such record is displayed and preserved.

1. Old Photographs

All old photographs were recollected and program, date and year wise segregated. All photographs are maintained in separate Photo Albums with captions so that the history, background and locations of the captured events may be preserved for proper maintenance.



2. Conversion of VCR Cassettes in to CDs/DVDs

For the extension of life of the recorded audio and video material, all VCR cassettes are converted in to CDs so that the mode of transmission of the recorded material may be made as per available functional modes of transmission. Now all recorded cassettes are converted are available in CDs. All CDs are labeled with name of the events, date and year of event organized and venue where it was held. Further, pieces of historical speeches, lectures and in case of music's are split which will be uploaded on the SGA you tube channel. All such material is being uploaded on the official website of the Association too.

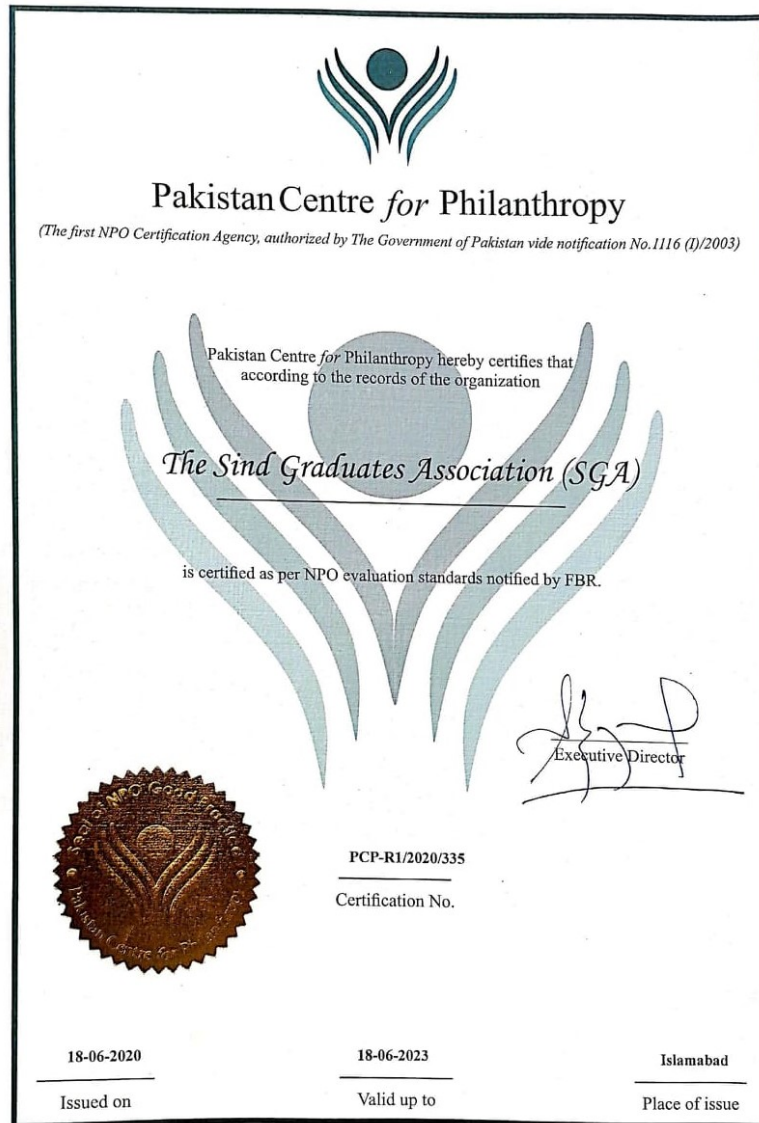
3. Compilation of History

In first phase the list of Central Executive Committee Members is collected and organized tenure wise since the year, SGA was came in existing (1972). Second, the list of all awards nominees is also collected and tenure wise reorganized, particularly of those prominent personalities who served the people of Sindh in different fields and were awarded by the SGA on its Annual Day. The separate books have been published in the name of "SGA Ithaas"- Part One, wherein history of CEC members, list of awarded persons and SGA publications is included. 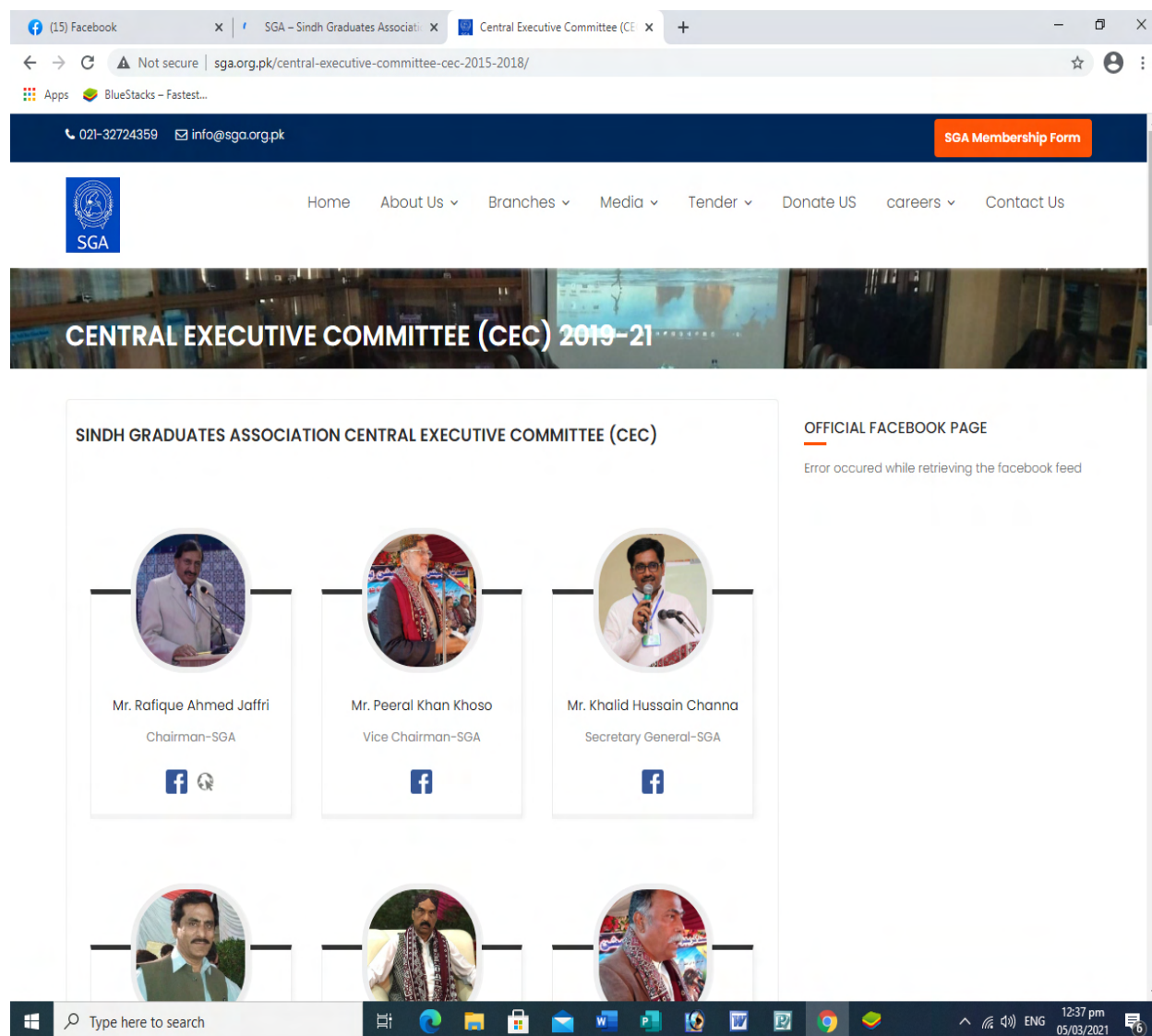
RENEWAL OF REGISTRATION OF SGA WITH PCP

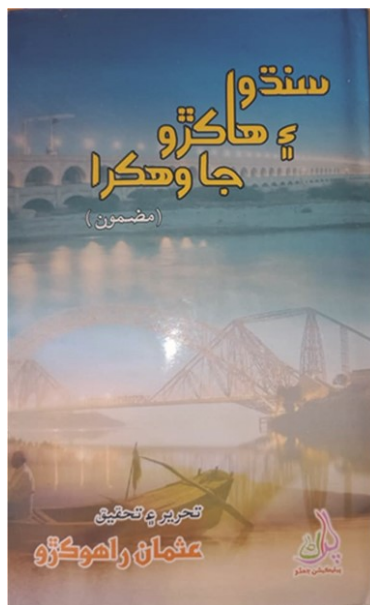
Sachal International Conference held at Karachi, Veena is the daughter of Shahdadkot where she had born, later after the separation of India she migrated to India and living with her

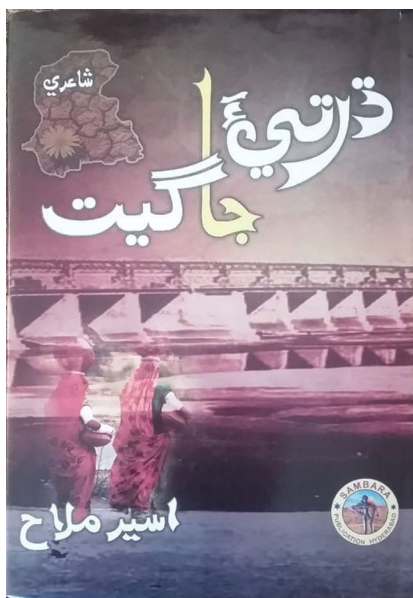

Book Launching Ceremony by SGA Branch Darro

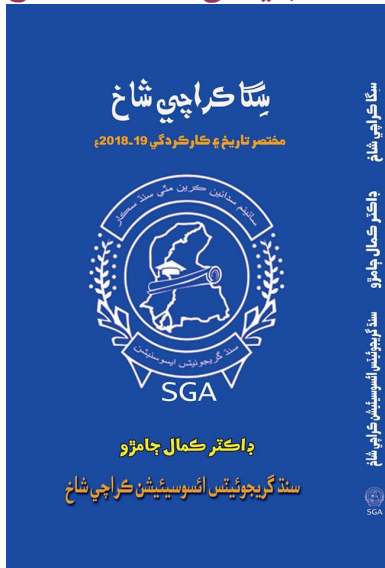

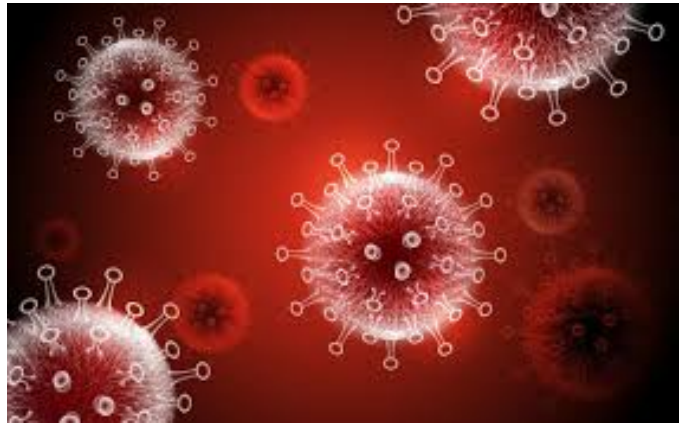

COVID-19

Activities carried out by Sindh Graduates Association to combat Corona Virus during Lockdown situation in Sindh



Affecting entire world , , the Corona Virus is now caused of critical situation in Sindh, although the number of Corona patients is increased day by day , therefore it is expected that number of patients will be increased rapidly in coming couple of weeks. Forecasting this situation there was need to keep people aware about the upcoming situation which can be more dangerous .The best way to prevent and slow down transmission of virus was to inform people about the COVID-19 virus and let them learned how it spreads out. It was also need to inform the people that they may protect themselves and others from infection by wearing mask, washing their hands and using an alcohol based rub (Sanitizer) frequently and do not touch their face unnecessarily .The COVID-19 virus spreads primarily through droplets of saliva or discharge from the nose when an infected person coughs or sneezes, so it's important that people also practice respiratory etiquette (for example, by coughing into a flexed elbow etc).

Impact of lockdown in Sindh

Due to increasing number of corona virus cases in the country, particularly in Sindh, the provincial government imposed lockdown decision in the province, due to lockdown the markets, hotels, restaurants were closed for couple of months, while city to city transportation including local rakshasa, carts were also stopped. In result of the imposed decision laborers working in industries, shops, individual workers, particular daily wage workers were deprived of having daily income. In Sindh this decision was strictly followed, that's why the worker class badly affected. The mason, laborer, cart taker, laborer working at shops, hotels, petrol pumps were sitting at home and looking for patronage.

Due to increasing number of corona virus cases in Sindh and consequently the drastic situation after taking lockdown decision, the provincial government had called for induction of volunteers who could help authorities in their campaign for containing the pandemic that had already affected people, which number has to be increased in coming days. In the result of increasing number of Corona patients, the Sindh Graduates Association decided to take part in this move to give awareness to the people of Sindh immediately and then made sure the provision of ration and other supported material to the affected families. As a whole the SGA took this issue at high priority and made few decisions as follows.

1. Staff of the SGA may be protected immediately
2. launching of move to aware and sensitize the people regarding Corona Virus through social and mass media.
3. The people of Sindh may be well aware through face to face dialogue and disseminate the information to protect people from Corona Virus
4. Provision of Ration, Soap, Surgical Masks, and Sanitizer to the affected potential families. Working in Home.

1. Staff of the SGA may be protected immediately

Looking at the severity of the issue the SGA management decided to close its head office established at Karachi. The staff members were instructed to make sure availability at their homes under the "working from home" policy, so that their lives may be safe and secure. The organization issues full salary on regular basis and other incentives to all employees of the organization.

2. launching of move to aware and sensitize the people regarding Corona Virus through Social and Mass Media.



The Face Book official page of SGA was made much more engaged to tag more and more information regarding the reasons how Corona Virus is viral, what are the symptoms of this Virus and how infected patient is treated. The material regarding precautionary measures was also uploaded on the page and was being shared widely with the viewers of the page. The number of sharing these posts was very much high, thousands of people were updated, informed and engaged with posts and sharing concerned material with each other and with their big number of friends.

3. The people of Sindh may be well aware through face to face dialogue and disseminate the information to protect people from Corona Virus

At the time when Government of Sindh had imposed the order of Lockdown in entire

province of Sindh, So in this situation, there was need of human resource who can help out government voluntarily. We are so fortunate to live in a part of the world where volunteer themselves do work for their people, particularly the volunteers of SGA are taking their due role. This time too we have observed closely that the youngsters are so keen to extend their helping hand. So to make this effort organized, SGA inducted a big number of volunteers announcing the mechanism through mainstream media and our social media platforms. The SGA made a plan to induct volunteers to take part in the individual movement for the awareness of the people, particularly people of rural areas. The strategy was to publish and distribute hand

bills , containing full information about how Corona Virus spreads from one person to another and also the precautionary measures to be taken and the treatment of the patient in case of hospitalization of the patient. Such decision was taken in the compliance of appeal by the Government of Sindh for the people from all walks of life to join hands to fight against this situation. This is also the core objective of the SGA to support our people, particularly in worst situation as it is was being faced.

All SGA branches were written letters by SGA regarding their role to aware the people around their locations. The big number of printed hand bills were also sent to SGA branches so that the volunteers may take their sessions with the people individually, may convince them so that the people may go in self isolation at their homes. The people were given hand bills clearly mentioned the symptoms of Corona Virus and precautions to avoid catching Corona Virus. All branches took sessions with individuals and distributed hand bills among the people. At few SGA branches medical doctors were taken onboard to take sessions with people and awared them regarding current situation and they were sensitized to take measures so that they may get rid of corona virus. In the result of these sessions and individual talk around 121,450 people of 89 locations / cities and sub urban areas of Sindh were sensitized on this issue, while thousands of hand bills were also distributed among the people. These locations were included as different locations of Karachi, Hyderabad, 5 locations of

Tharparkar, Mirpur Khas, Shahpur Chakar , Talhar, Gharo, Thatta, Jamshoro , Bhan, Dadu, Sehwan , Phulji, Mehar, Seeta Road, 13 locations of district larkana and Qambar Shahdadt, Shikarpur, Phul, Nosheroferoze, Ghotki, Halla, Khipro, Kashmore, Pano Aqil and others.



ii) Distribution of Surgical Masks and Sanitizer

The SGA branches also distributed sufficient number of surgical masks and Sanitizer among the people so that people may be protected well to take corona virus at any place. In all SGA branches 7,058 soaps and 1835 sanitizers were distributed among the people. The people were informed well about the use of surgical masks and were also known that they can also make their own surgical masks locally at their homes, in case masks are not available in the local markets. Few branches arranged sanitized water to wash hands of the visitors of the market. The sanitized water tanks and drums were placed at few spots for the proper hand washing of the people.



iii) Ration provided to needy and potential families

Sindh Graduates Association tried at its level best to make sure the support of affected families in this situation. The SGA branches identified the actual needy and potential families, particularly those daily wage workers who are also heads of their families and were deprived of daily income. The SGA branches are engaged providing ration (food items) to such families around their localities. Yet, up to 17th May-2020, total 11,494 families have been provided ration at 62 different cities/sub urban areas/ and villages. While this noble work is still continued at all branches. The provision of ration and other necessary items is being done with self-help basis, where volunteers are collecting money from their own pockets and also seeking financial support from local philanthropists as well.





Branch wise contribution to support needy and potential families

Due to pandemic situation in entire Pakistan and especially in Sindh, SGA branches took their due role at their level best. Although more than hundren branches were engaged with the affected families but more than half of the branches supported at large scale. Among those branches SGA Branch Sachal Goth distributed ration of Rs. 893,000 among 488 families, SGA Gulshan Hadeed Branch supported 1003 families by providing ration of Rs.14, 11,738, while SGA Dadu Branch provided ration to 1388 families of cost Rs. 2,327,000, SGA Ghotki Branch provided ration of Rs. 1,044,450 to 564 families, SGA Branch Sehwan provided ration of Rs. 394,000 to 236 families, SGA Moro Branch provided ration of Rs. 250,000 to 204 families, SGA Karachi women branch distributed ration of Rs. 605,000 to 207 families, SGA Mirpur Khas branch distributed ration of Rs. 394,950 to 265 families, SGA Branch Shahdadkot branch distributed ration of Rs. 341,800 to 289 families, SGA Pano Aaqil Branch distributed ration of Rs. 895,500 to 562 families, SGA Shahpur Chakar Branch distributed ration of Rs. 539,500 to 371 families, SGA Paat Sharif Branch distributed ration of Rs. 423,500 to 275 families, SGA Phulji Station Branch distributed ration of Rs. 289,000 to 287 families, SGA Gambat Branch distributed ration of Rs. 518,000 to 172 families, SGA Thull Branch distributed ration of Rs. 204,050 to 220 families, SGA Kashmore Branch distributed ration of Rs. 282,500 to 220 families, SGA Mehrabpur Branch distributed ration of Rs. 1,130,000 to 340 families, SGA Kaloi Branch distributed ration of Rs. 100,000 to 270 families, SGA Mehrabpur Branch distributed ration of Rs. 1,130,000 to 340 families, SGA Bhan Sayed Abad Branch distributed ration of Rs. 573,000 to 374 families, SGA Daulatpur Branch distributed ration of Rs. 320,000 to 260 families, SGA Islamabad Branch distributed ration of Rs. 600,000 to 300 families and SGA Shikarpur Branch distributed ration of Rs. 494,400 to 412 families.

Lecture Program by SGA branch Shahdad Kot on "Role of Women in the Poetry of Shah Abdul Latif Bhittai"

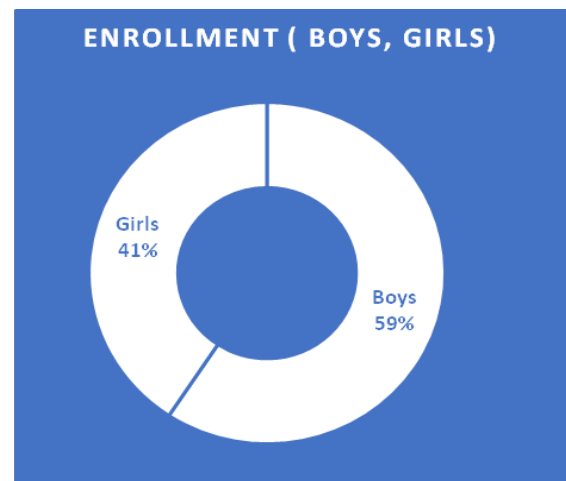
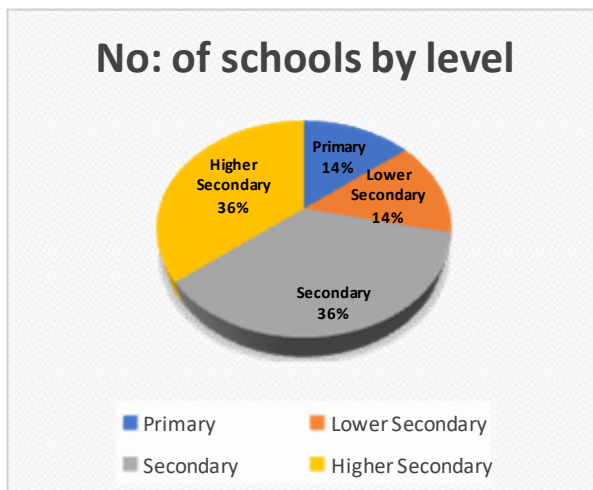

EDUCATION SECTOR



The Roshan Tara School (RTS) System is a formal education system running by SGA in different districts of Sindh province since 1980 on self-help basis. Currently SGA is running 21 schools in Sindh under one name of "Roshan Tara Schools (RTSs)". The objectives of the School system are to provide quality education to students of poor families on nominal fees charges. To get the main purpose to provide qualitative education to vulnerable poor people of Sindh, since 1980, the number of Roshan Tara Schools is increasing year by year and currently there are 21 Roshan Tara Schools (04 primary, 04 lower secondary, 10 secondary and 03 Higher Secondary) running in Sindh. Out of these schools, 14 are owned, 07 are rented having 395 teaching and 98 non-teaching staff, while strength of boys in schools is 4,539 while the girls or 3,325. Total 7,864 students are enrolled throughout 21 Roshan Tara Schools.



For the ownership and for the proper management of schools, the parallel administrative bodies are formed to look after schools operations and other related matters at school level by the concerned stakeholders. The structure & TORs in schools administrative bodies is given below.

School Management Committees (SMCs)

The Schools Management Committees are formed to look after and regulate policies in Roshan Tara Schools. Locally all the matters of Roshan Tara Schools are managed by School Management Committees (SMCs), which are annually re-elected through a democratic process of election managed by concerned Branch Management Committees (BMCs) of SGA. The SMC is fully empowered to take financial and administrative decisions regarding school matters.

Central Roshan Tara Schools Management Committee (CRTSMC) Meeting



The Central Roshan Tara Schools Management Committee (CRTSMC) is the superior body to look after Roshan Tara School's matters and take decisions to resolve the issues. This committee is comprising of all RTS concerned SMC Chairmen and Principals of the schools, one member is also included in the committee as an educational expert from the outside, while this committee is headed by Secretary Education, SGA. This committee has to meet once in a quarter where all school's Principals and SMC Chairmen's present the performance of their schools in the forum. During the reporting period (2019-2020) all required meetings were held accordingly, all the CRTMC meetings were headed by Secretary Education of the SGA. The major issues discussed in the above meetings were, sustainability of weaker Roshan Tara schools, to increase the involvement of parents in the schools, ownership and other day to day matters like celebration of international days, organizing sports weeks in the schools and policy related issues. In the last year, 2019-2020 major agenda of the meetings was to

discuss the impact of Corona Virus in the schools and due to closing of schools developing alternative plans to manage school education, particularly promotion of classes and initiating online classes. The committee also decided to arrange and organize events of exposure and competitive programme in order to enhance the capacity of the students by exchanging the competitive talents. Such events were All Roshan Tara Baalik Melo (All Roshan Tarians Children Festival (Celebration of Teachers day and Literacy Day.

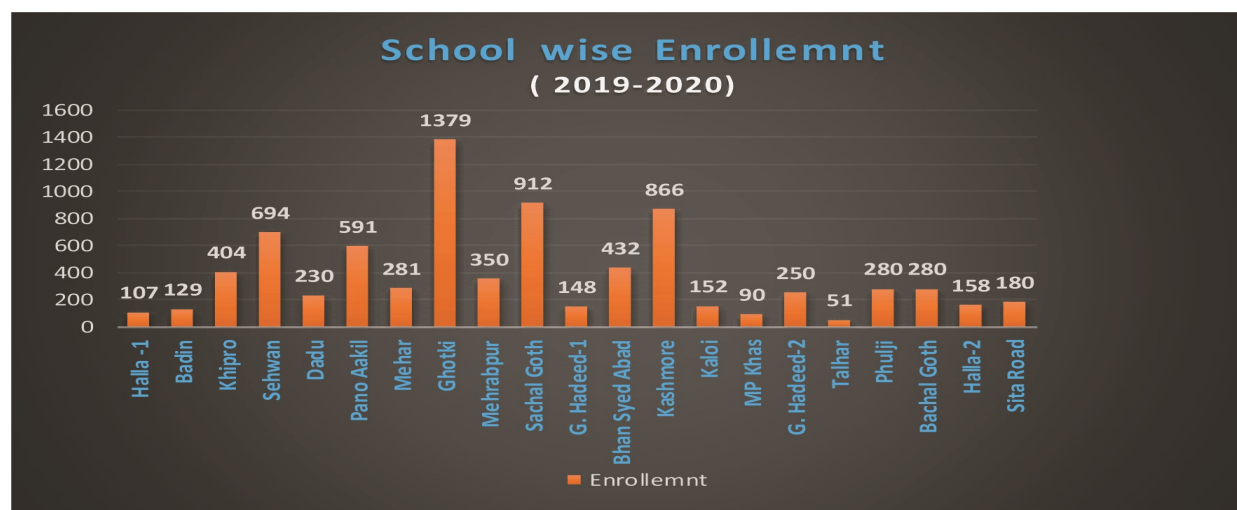
PROGRESS

Academic Session (2019-2020)



Currently the Association has been managing a Chain of 21 Roshan Tara Schools in different 13 districts of the Sindh province. These RTSS are engaged providing qualitative education to the children of poor families since last 4 decades. Roshan Tara Schools charge nominal fees against provision of high standard education and conducive learning environment in the schools. These schools are located as 3 schools in district Karachi

which are Sachal Goth, Bachal Goth and Gulshan Hadeed, one school each at Badin, Talhar, Kaloi, Mirpur Khas, Sehwan, Bhan Syed Abad, Dadu, Mehar, Sita Road, Khipro, Phulji Station, Halla, Mehrabpur, Pano Akil, Kashmore and Ghotki. In these schools from KG class to class XII, total 7,864 students are enrolled and getting quality education. The school wise enrollment chart is given as below.



Roshan Tara Schools Performance at a Glance

1. Roshan Tara School is a girl's education focused inclusive program, wherein 41 % of the students are girl students. This ratio has to be increased year by year.

7. RTS Secretariat Annually conducts a program to give Tribute to Teachers for encouraging and acknowledge the dedicated services of teachers of Roshan Tara Schools. During the academic year 2019-2020, teacher's day was celebrated as well.
8. Regular monitoring mechanism of the schools is designed and being followed. The strategic planning of Roshan Tara Schools is also made.
9. Regular publication of various pamphlets, handouts, academic calendars, magazines etc.
10. Development and preparation of various projects of education sector for school developments.
11. Annually celebration of World Teachers' and Literacy Day.
12. Regular Capacity Building Program on "Teaching Pedagogy" & ECD for all teachers of Roshan Tara Schools.
13. Arrangement of Sports week in all Roshan Tara Schools for the promotion of sports activities in the schools.
14. Organized Plantation Campaign to all Roshan Tara Schools to combat with Global Warming.
15. Celebration of Cultural events, Language day to promote Sindhi language and culture day in Roshan Tara Schools.
16. Student's health is being monitored through health screening programs in all Roshan Tara Schools
17. Preparation of Schools Development Plans for all weaker Roshan Tara Schools.
18. Planned Scheme of Studies from class 1 to Matric , distributed and being followed in all schools
19. Quarterly conducting "Central Roshan Tara Schools Meetings".
20. Organized mega event of 2 days "Baalik Mella "this academic year on 21 & 22, February - 2020 at Hyderabad.
21. Planned a mega program for RTS Illumines at Hyderabad on 21st Feb-2020
22. Online classes were taken during pandemic situation in Sindh, due to Covid-19 all Roshan Tara Schools were oriented and sensitized on the issue well. All schools were following SOPs strictly in the schools.

As per notification of government of Sindh (department of education) regarding promotion of all students without conducting their annual examination 2019-20 from grade KG to Class VIII, all Roshan Tara Schools made a complete compliance of this notification & promoted all its students of said grades into next classes accordingly. It was all done with the prior approval of worthy Secretary Education SGA Mr Abdul Hameed Bullo .However all students of RTSs from classes I to XII has been passed and promoted to the next grade, Each and

every student have been given an extra 3% marks and have been promoted to the next grade, even those students who had failed their classes have been passed via as grace marks. This way, no student in the schools have been failed or left behind. "The students of classes X and XII are passed on the basis of their previous board results.

"Those students who wanted to reappear for their exams to improve their grades can appear in the Exams next year. As per the Government policy this term no special examinations has to be taken place in all Roshan Tara Schools. These decisions were taken as per notification disseminated by School & literacy department Govt of Sindh.

Online Classes initiated by Roshan Tara Schools



During Covid-19 where Sindh province was in crises and ongoing pandemic was further strain the education system, all that period the school management had forced dilemma, in that period it was decided that all schools must be closed. It was need of the hour to shutdown educational institutes as keeping them open would further exacerbate the ongoing health crises. As the concept of home schooling is barely adopted in Sindh and many parents could either not teach the course material to their children or are even simply not even awarded that such option exist. Even through some schools moved towards online modes of education, the number were not large enough, owing to connectivity issues, as well as the novelty of the setup, there were lots of trial and error involved, leading to uncertainty for everyone, specially since some assessment were also moved online. But few schools couldn't move towards the online system, its main reason was lack of availability of internet system, internet access, environment at homes and also due to state of poverty. Those schools who run classes online were RTS Gulshan-e-Hadeed 1 & II ,RTS Kashmore, RTS Ghotki, RTS Halla, I & II , RTS Khipro RTS Pano Akil and RTS Sachal Goth , they adopted online line education system in their schools.

Cluster wise one day Teachers Training Program



Teacher learning is a continuous process that promote teachers' teaching skills, master new knowledge, develop new proficiency, which in turn, help improve students' learning. In the pursuance of the objectives one day workshop was organized at RTS Gulshan Hadeed, Karachi on 20th July-2019. The core objective of this workshop was to enhance the skills of teachers in the learning areas of teaching new Active English, Amazing Science, and Countdown Maths by oxford Effective Teaching Methodologies and understand the Oxford books for getting better teaching & learning outcomes.

Whereas in Hyderabad cluster, which was organized on 26th October-2019 at Gul Ursani High School Qasimabad, Hyderabad, where 40 teachers from Roshan Tara School Kaloi, Mirpur Khas, Khipro, Badin, Halla I & Halla II participated in the training.

HEALTH SECTOR



Sindh Graduates Association (SGA) has remained involved in a range of support activities ranging from an Advocacy Platform to social sector activities and poverty reduction in varying ways and through multiple interventions since last over 48 years. The main thematic areas of the Association are Health, Education, Social Mobilization, Poverty Alleviation and Social Welfare Development. The Association is also duly certified from Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy (PCP). Since last one decade SGA has gradually focused much of its attention on education and health given the phenomenal vacuum both in terms of school participation with quality education in Sindh and health initiatives. Besides these, the Association do arrange regular Community Health Camps of Eye, Skin, Hepatitis B&C, Clift lips and measles in almost all the branches across Sindh province , wherein thousands of poor and underprivileged people are operated and provided free of cost medical checkup facilities and medicines. These all activities are carried out with the support of community and local philanthropists.

SGA started this program from 1978 with the support of local philanthropists and branch volunteers. It has been observed and reported that Health is one of the key thematic areas of SGA which needs immediate and long term planning to support poor segment of our society. Since SGA has contributed a lot in this thematic area which is very much appreciated and acknowledged everywhere, especially Eye and Skin camps.

Keeping in view the above situation, the SGA addressed health needs of the population by various initiatives, all aimed at improving health and hygienic conditions of the people in general and the poor in particular. Without taking care of this need at all levels, a community cannot be prepared to face other social and economic challenges.

One of the SGA's earliest and longest core program of the Association is organizing medical camps. These camps relate to the frequent and common occurrence of eye and skin diseases in the region. This is a regular practice of all SGA Branches' network to arrange and conduct Community Medical Camps with the assistance of the Society for the Prevention and Cure of Blindness (Karachi) and the Welfare Association of Dermatology Patients (Karachi) and other organizations.

Community Health through Medical Camps

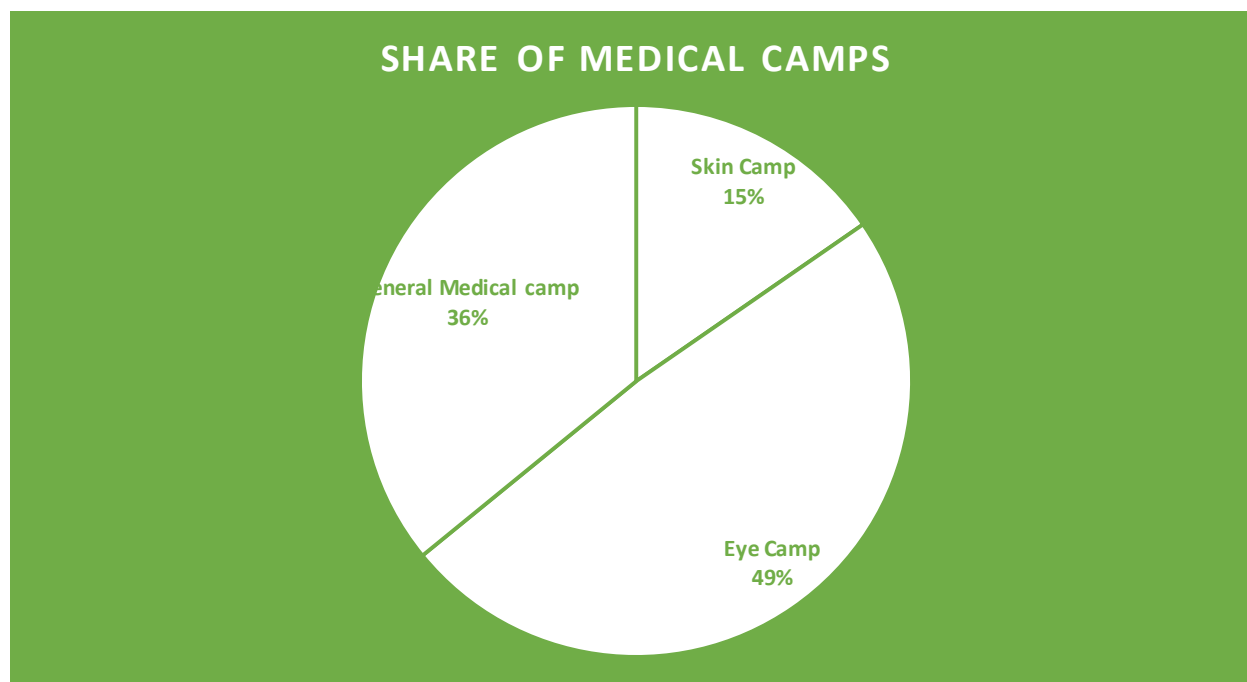
It is a regular feature of Sindh Graduates Association to arrange medical camps and provide treatment and medicine to poor and underprivileged people of Sindh. This component of health sector is being carried out by the SGA branches network across Sindh and Islamabad. The SGA branches make all necessary arrangements of Eye, Skin, Hepatitis B&C, Sugar Test Camps, General Medical Campus, Polio Medical Camps, and Thalassemia etc and register patients. These camps fully facilitate poor and deserving people coming up with the situation.



In the last year, 2019-2020 total 39 Medical Camps were arranged by different SGA branches in most backward and remote areas of Sindh. In these camps 37,899 patients of having different diseases were examined by the expert doctors and were treated accordingly. Out of

these 39 camps 6 camps were of Skin Camps, while 19 were Eye Camps and rest of 14 were of General Medical Camps.





Skin Camps

The camps are mostly arranged in the most remote and backwards areas of Sindh, where access to the health facilities is a big issue. In the last year 2019-2020, a total of 6 Skin disease camps were arranged by the different SGA branches in entire Sindh, where 7,644 patients were registered/provided medical check-up facilities and provided free medicine.

CDP PROJECT



Improve Quality of Education through establishing IT & Science Labs, and Installation of Solar System in Roshan Tara Schools.

Sindh Graduates Association is running a project for the quality improvement education in selected Roshan Tara Schools being run by SGA. This project is supported by Community Development Program, Planning and Development Department, Government of Sindh since, 2017.

Since the inception of the project different components of the project has been completed in the year, 2018-2019 like Installation of Solar Syaytems in the selected Schools and establishing Science Labs. While in the last year, 2018-2019 schools were further supported as below.

IT & Science Labs established in Roshan Tara Schools

This was major component of the project, under this component IT and Science labs were established in 7 Roshan Tara Schools. The schools were included Roshan Tara School Bachal Goth, Roshan Tara School Sachal Goth, Roshan Tara School Gulshan Hadeed, Roshan Tara School Phulji Station, Roshan Tara School Badin, Roshan Tara School MP Khas, Roshan Tara School Kaloi and Roshan Tara School Pano Aaqil. The IT Labs are established in all above schools, while one IT instructor is also appointed there so that the students of upper classes can be trained well. Whereas Science Labs were also established in same above schools except Roshan Tara School Bachal Goth, Karachi. One more Roshan Tara School where Science Lab is established is Rohan Tara School that is RTS Sehwan.





School Development Component

SGA has worked out on the school development components and conducted meetings with Roshan Tara Schools. There are total 8 schools i.e. Roshan Tara School Phulji Station, RTS Bachal Goth, RTS Kaloi, RTS Sachal Goth, RTS Mirpur Khas, RTS Gulshan-e-Hadeed, RTS Pano Akil and RTS Badin, where under one major component of School Development, the work has been done as following three sub components of school development.

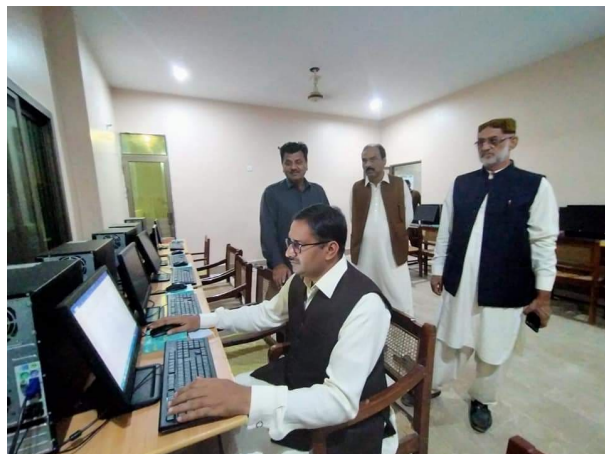
- Whitewash / Color of all above schools have been completed
- Fitting / Wiring of Electricity System particularly in Science and IT Labs is also completed
- Renovation of Washrooms (4 wash rooms in each school) has been done.

Monitoring Visits and Closure of the Project

Monitoring Visits paid by SGA Officials

All schools were visited by SGA officials to see the quality work done by the School Management Committees of relative Roshan Tara Schools. The Secretary General SGA Mr Khalid Hudsain Channa , the Secretary Finance and Chairman of Procurement Committee of CDP Project , Mr Noor Muhammad Siyal , General Manager SGA Mr Imam Ali Deetho and

Senior Manager- Finance SGA Mr Abu Jaffer visited all Roshan Tara Schools and checked the quality work done as per set standards. All schools were found quite satisfactory in terms of completion of all components and quality of the work done by SMCs of the Roshan Tara Schools.



Monitoring Visit by CDP Officials

The Community Development Project (CDP) which was started in 2017 has been completed and closed down by the end of June-2020. All components of the project has been completed accordingly. While by the end of the project a "Project Completion Report- PCR" was submitted by SGA at CDP officials. In the light of submitted PCR an extensive field visit of all above schools was also paid by the CDP officials, Government of Sindh. The each one component was visited and checked well as per the quality made sure in the project document. At the end of the project, a final satisfactory report by the CDP officials was submitted at SGA which reveals the satisfactory performance by SGA under the CDP project



SOCIAL SECTOR DEVELOPMENT

Poverty Alleviation Project with Khushhali Bank



Keeping in view the severity of state of poverty in Sindh and consequent impacts, the Sindh Graduates Association decided to take its role to alleviate the poverty in Sindh. For the enhancement of entrepreneurship and promotion of Agriculture and Livestock sectors in Sindh, SGA has made an agreement with Khushhali Bank. As per agreement signed between Sindh Graduates Association (SGA) and Khushhali Bank Ltd, the Service Provider (SGA) has to identify and organize the potential and prospect households (HHds) willing to start their own small business or willing to invest their own money to develop small area of their agricultural land or animals. As per agreement the role of SGA is form groups of 5-10 people, who are socially bound to utilize loan productively and return back same to the concerned bank. The SGA's role under this MoU is just to identify groups and facilitate them taking loan from KBL. Such project was initiated from Larkana in August-2002, while with the passage of time project was extended to further 9 districts i.e. District Nawab Shah, Ghotki, Shikarpur, Mirpur Khas, Naushero Feroze, Dadu, Tando Allahyar, Tando Mohammad Khan, Khairpur Mir's. Presently SGA is operating this project in district Thatta, Badin, TM Khan, Tando Allahyar, Mirpur Khas, Nosheroferoze, Dadu, Qambar Shahdadkot, Larkana, Shikarpur, Kashmore Kandhkoat and in district Ghotki.

Objectives of the Project

- To organize the rural community and to help them to save a proportion of their income for individual and collective requirements.
- Organizing households for their social and economic unity
- To focus development as well as socio-economic issues affecting poor communities of rural areas
- Strengthening the solidarity and cohesiveness of poor community and mobilize them to form Community Organizations (Social Groups) through a participatory process.
- To enhance capacity of Community Organizations/Community Group Members (Men and Women) by enabling them to identify, select, implement and manage their income generating and income smoothening activities.
- To reach as many communities as possible in order to determine magnitude of poverty, socio-economic status, demography, civic amenities, infrastructure and potential for future development.

- To give boost up to the entrepreneurship, agriculture and livestock for the denting poverty status in rural and backward areas in Sindh.
- To conduct regular meetings of first cycle Community Groups (CGs) to keep them active.

CAPACITY BUILDING OF KBL PROJECT STAFF

Sindh Graduates Association is running a mega project for the poverty alleviation in rural areas of Sindh. This project is running with a team of Social Mobilizers whose responsibility is to mobilize the people through formation of their social groups. In this project 59 Social mobilizers are engaged at 17 locations/branches. For the capacity building of the Social Mobilizers 2 days trainings were conducted in 2 groups , one each at Hyderabad and other one at Larkana.

TRAINING AT LARKANA

23-24, Dec-2019

Two days training was started from 23-24 Decemebre-2019 at Sapna Hotel Larkana, where Social Mobilizers of branch Mehrabpur, Khairpur Mir's, Mehar, Daharki, Kandhkoat, Kashmore, Shikarpur, Ratodero, Shahdad Kot and Badeh attended the training. The SGA officials including Secretary General SGA Mr Khalid Hussain Channa, Coordinator SGA-KBL Project and Deputy Secretary General Mr Javed Ahmed Unar, General Manager SGA Imam Ali Detho and Mr Qurban Ali Bhanbhro attended the training and took sessions. Mr Awais Babar, Area Coordinator KBL Larkana region also attended the training and took session on the process of credit appraisal and required documentation for the loanees. The SMs were trained on how to do work with community, how to identify potential loanees, the process to be adopted, the documentation required, tips for recovery of the loan and social mobilization process. At the end of the second day, trainees were given the certificates by the guests of the event.



TRAINING AT HYDERABAD

10-11, January-2020

Two days training was conducted at RDF Guest House Hyderabad from 10-11, January 2020, where Social Mobilizers of branch Gharo, Shaheed Fazal Raho, TM Khan, Tando Allahyar, MP Khas, Jhudo, Kot Ghulam Muhammad and Noshehro Feroze attended the training. The SGA officials including Secretary General SGA Mr Khalid Hussain Channa, Coordinator SGA-KBL Project and Deputy Secretary General Mr Javed Ahmed Unar, General Manager SGA Imam Ali Detho and Mr Qurban Ali Bhanbhro attended the training and took sessions. Mr Anneal Kumar who is the Branch Manager KBL Tando Allahyar participated in the training and took session on Credit Policies and Process to be adopted. The SMs were trained on how to do work with community, how to identify potential loanees, the process to be adopted, the documentation required, tips for recovery of the loan and social mobilization process. At the end of the second day certificates distribution ceremony was held wherein SGA higher officials including Chairman SGA Mr Rafique Ahmed Jaffery and others attended the ceremony and distributed certificates among the trainees.



PROGRESS OF THE YEAR

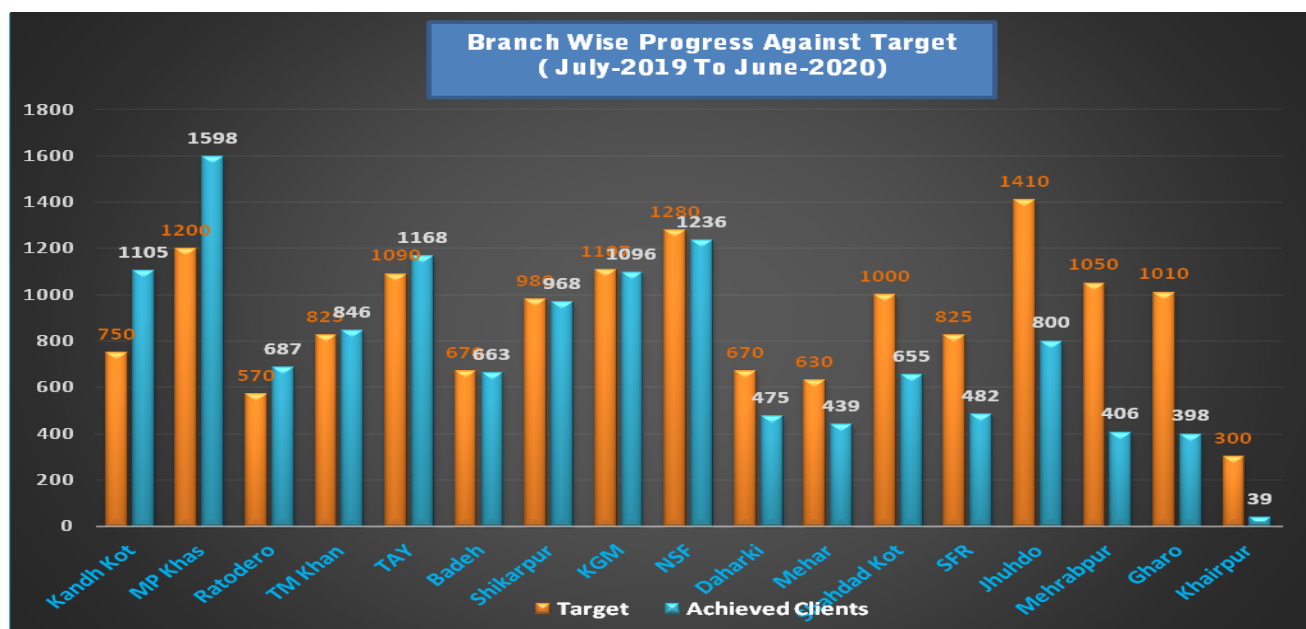
July-2019 – June-2020

The progress of KBL project, for the year 2019-2020 remained quite lower than of last financial year, that was 2018-2019. Total target for the year was to generate 16,181 clients, while 13, 457 clients were generated. That is 84 % achievement for the year, 2019-2020. The major cause of lower performance was due to Covid-19 situation took place in Sindh including in Pakistan and around the world. Due to Covid-19 and lockdown decisions by the Government of Sindh, KBL management had closed down their branch offices and all operations for 2 consecutive months that were April-May-2020. Although project offices were reopened and operations were started later but KBL management declined the targets of sale of the clients. In the below chart, the decreased in the progress can be seen from April-June-2020, that shows clear dip, due to affect of Covid-19.



PROGRESS OF THE BRANCHES (July-2019 to Jun-2020)

Despite of Corona Virus and Lockdown situation in Sindh, more than half of the branches achieved their targets. The Kandh Kot branch generated 1105 clients against the annual target of 750. The achievement of Kandh Kot branch remains at 147 %, whereas the progress of Mirpur Khas, Ratodero, Tando Muhammad Khan and Tando Allahyar remained 133 %, 121 %, 103 % and 107 % respectively. The progress remained lower particularly at those branches where sale of the clients were stopped by the KBL management due to Covid-19 situation.



SGA PUBLICATIONS



The information is one of the important portfolio of Sindh Graduates Association, which is responsible for all kind of information, decisions and updates need to be disseminate and circulated among the members of the Association. The Information Department is established at SGA head office, which is working under Secretary Information Mr. Abdul Latif Kartio. The Information Department is taking key role to give awareness to the SGA volunteers and common people of Sindh province. As Sindh Graduates has more than 90 active branches, which are very much busy in conducting different activities for the benefit of the people. For the documentation of the activities and let it to inform to the other people of Sindh a "Quarterly Newsletter" is being published at SGA head office level. Under the leadership of Chairman, Secretary General and

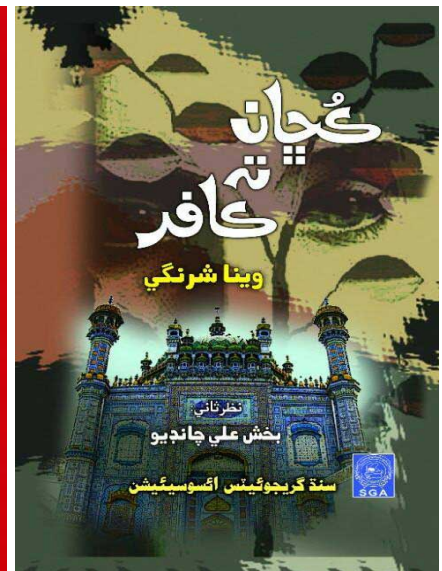
Secretary Information a monthly magazine is being published, which provides platform to all stake holders (Individuals and branches and Roshan Tara Schools) to share their activities and other updates in the magazine and for other publications.

The publication work started from 1999 in SGA when a magazine started on Environment in the name of "Hayaati" under the editorship of late Shamsheerul Hyderi (a founder member of SGA), which remained continued till 2001. It was again started and republished in June-2010 under the editorship of Mr. Ali Muhammad Memon. Later Sindh Graduates Association organized "Sindhi Language Conference in 2016 at Karachi, for the proper reporting and recording of the great event, SGA started "Quarterly Sindh Graduates News" publication immediate after the conference, while Sindhi Language Conference was reported in detail in the newsletter. Latter Sindh Graduates News magazine published its quarterly magazine in the last quarter of the year -2018, which was special issue on the occasion of 47th Annual Anniversary of Sindh Graduates Association.

In the year 2019-2020 total three numbers of quarterly magazines under the name "SGA Smaachar" published. First quarterly magazine published for the period Jul-Sept-2019,

while second for the period of next quarter , that was Oct-Dec-2019 , while 3rd and last magazine was published combined for remaining 2 quarters , that were Jan-2020 to June-2020. In the year total three numbers were published for widely publicity of the activities take place in Roshan Tara Schools and other activities and updates in rest of sectors of SGA, i-e Health, Information, Culture, Education, Finance, Women Development and SGA branches. Now this newsletter is being published regularly with the revival of its old name "SGA Smaachar" since April-2019.

In the last year one book in the name" Kuchan Ta Kaafir" was published by Dr Muhammad Suleman Shaikh Research and development Centre , SGA . This book is written by well know Sindhi writer Ms Veena Shirangi.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE CENTRAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Opinion
